<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Levels of 'all crime' are really positive, with crime being down 6% on the previous year to date and down 5% on the previous quarter. Our target is a 2% year on year reduction and considering the impact that the recession was anticipated to have on crime, this is unexpectedly positive. Against the historic measure of the BCS comparator crimes, crime is down 21% against the baseline set in 2003/04 which is the best it has been. Burglary however continues to be the one major problem and this is reflected in the force overview where Cheltenham is shown to be clearly deteriorating in the county. The partnership has funded a Christmas Crime campaign through the Police. The CCSP finally endorsed its action plan to run from autumn 2009 to autumn 2010. A multi agency meeting was held in the run up to Bonfire Night to ensure community safety and there were no incidents. The CCSP is in the process of allocating its remaining under spend for 2009/10 with SCP. The Street Pastor scheme went live on Saturday 5 December in Cheltenham with a team going out from 10pm until 4am. - Ongoing rising burglary figures
- In previous years, the district community safety / crime and disorder reduction partnerships have been allocated funding to address local priorities that fit in with county priorities through the Area Based Grant from the Gloucestershire Safer and Stronger Communities Partnership. This year however, the outcome groups that sit under the GSSCP have been asked to identify their priorities and make bids for funding. Therefore, the district partnerships will be able to help decide how some of the outcome group pots are spent, (for example outcome 21 is to reduce crime and the fear of crime and so the CDRPs could bid for some funding through that), but there is not going to be any funding allocated directly to the partnerships for them to decide how best to allocate.
