PROGRESS IN LAST PERIOD:

- Fiesta in the Park event very successful with 3000 estimated to have attended.
- Visits to parish councils and regeneration partnerships underway to discuss neighbourhood management roll out.
- Agreed to fund 8 projects through the small grants round:
 1. **Oasis Youth Centre - Gaptime Project** through which young people engage in positive community activities in return for credits
 2. **Onside - Kick It** football training with Cheltenham Town FC in Hesters Way
 3. **Onside - St Pauls**
 4. **Whaddon SCT-** St Pauls mini bike project to provide a safe and supervised venue for a motorbike club.
 5. **Oakley Regeneration Partnership** – subsidy of schools sweatshirts to support the bringing together of the school communities of Lynworth and Whaddon as they join to become ‘Oakwood School’.
 6. **Street Pastors** - to provide training for Street Pastors who will protect vulnerable people Friday and Saturday nights in the town centre.
 7. **Infobuzz** - Domestic abuse support programme working with young people who have witnessed or been a victim of domestic abuse.
 8. **CBH** – Everyman Theatre work with young people to reduce ASB
